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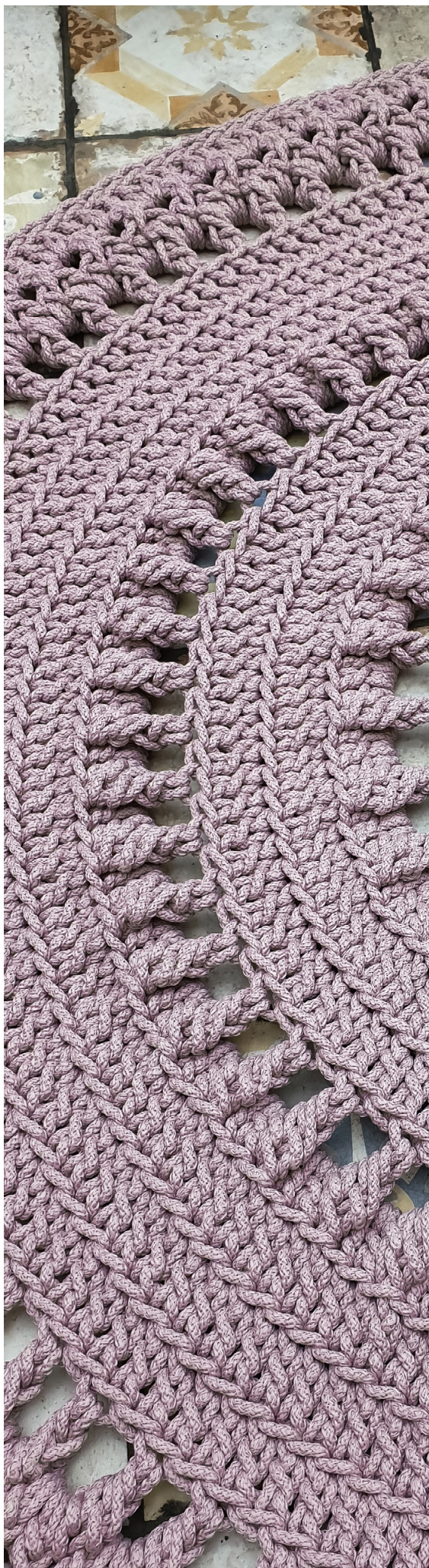

- 5 mm polyester cord \approx 650 yards length (600 m)
- size 10 mm crochet hook (№15 / 000)

Skill level:

attentive beginner

Size of the finished item \approx 42 1/2 (1.08 m)

ABBREVIATIONS (US crochet terms)

N. – next.

St. - stitch(es).

Pr. – previous.

CH – a chain stitch.

ARCH...CH – chain arch (stitch number will be indicated).

SL ST – a slip stitch.

BLO – back loops only.

DC – double crochet.

FDC – double crochet you crochet at the beginning. Pull a loop to the length of desired stitch. Holding a stitch on the hook, wrap it around the stitch, grab working yarn. Holding working yarn, go to the place where you start, I mean remove one wrapping. 2 loops are still on hook, crochet through them at once.

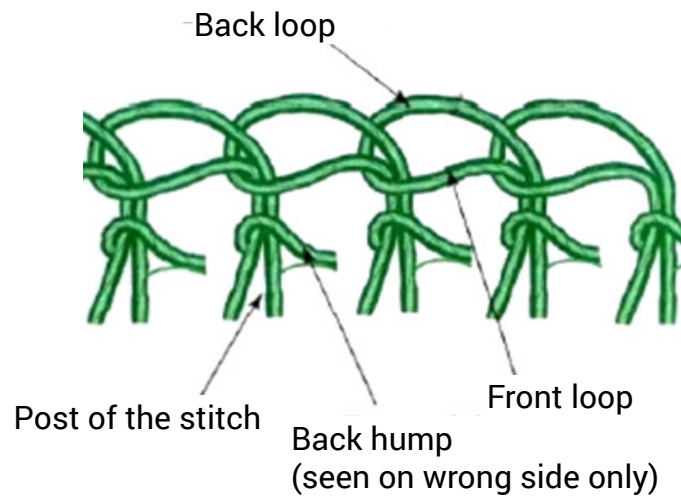
FP-... – front post stitch.

CLUSTER- a group of stitch worked into one stitch and closed together. Crochet indicated stitch number into the foundation, leaving last loops of each stitch unused. Grab working yarn; draw working yarn through all remained loops at once.

SPLIT-... – a group of stitches worked into different stitches and closed together. Crochet stitches into indicated foundation, leaving last loops of each stitch unused. Grab working yarn, then draw it through all loops at once.

Pattern notes:

1. It may help to understand stitch anatomy to crochet.



2. *(Pattern notes are in round brackets)*
3. **[Rapport details are in square brackets]**



Rounds	Details	Stitch number in each round
	<p>Make a sliding loop:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make a loop, yarn tail is placed on the right and it is on the loop, and working yarn is on the left, it is placed down. • Insert hook into the loop bottom up. Turn it around, grab working yarn and crochet a stitch. • As a result, you made a sliding loop with CH1. 	
1	<p>Crochet 2 more chain stitches (<i>instead of first DC</i>), 10 DC into a sliding loop. Hold a yarn tail near a sliding loop. Crochet 1 more DC, grabbing a sliding loop and yarn tail simultaneously. Pull remained yarn tail out – pull a sliding loop closed.</p> <p>SL ST into first DC.</p>	12 DC
2	<p>FDC,</p> <p>[CH2, DC into n. DC into back (top) loop (BLO)] – 11 times.</p> <p>CH2, SL ST into HDC.</p>	<p>12 DC 12 Chain arches-CH2</p>
3	<p>SL ST into n. chain arch, FDC, 2 DC into the same chain arch, CLUSTER-2FP-DC around n.st. 16	SL ST into n. chain arch, FDC, 1 DC into the same chain arch, CLUSTER-2FP-DC around n.st. (<i>see my notes in the 3rd round</i>), [2 DC into n. chain arch, CLUSTER-2FP-DC around n.st.] – 89 times. SL ST into HDC.	180 DC 90 CLUSTERS-2FP-DC
17	SL ST into n. st., FP-SL ST around the same st., CH2, skip CLUSTER, FP-DC around n.st. (<i>they form first SPLIT stitch-2FP-DC</i>), [CH2, SPLIT STITCH-2FP-DC (<i>see my notes below</i>)] - 89 times. CH2, SL ST into first SPLIT STITCH-2FP-DC. SPLIT STITCH-2FP-DC: crochet 2 st. into one stitch and close them together the following way: 1. FP-DC around n. DC in the round below, leaving last loop unused. 2. Skip CLUSTER in the round below. 3. FP-DC around n. DC in the round below, leaving last loop unused. 4. 3 loops are still on hook. 5. Grab working yarn, crochet through all loops on hook at once	90 SPLIT stitches -2FP-DC 90 Chain arches-CH2

18	<p>SL ST into n. chain arch, FDC, 1 DC into the same chain arch,</p> <p>[DC into n. SPLIT STITCH into BLO, DC into n. chain arch, DC into n. SPLIT STITCH into BLO, 2 DC into n. chain arch] – 44 times.</p> <p>DC into n. SPLIT STITCH into BLO, DC into n. chain arch, DC into n. SPLIT STITCH into BLO, SL ST into HDC.</p>	225 DC
19	<p>[SL ST into n. st.] – to the end of the round. <i>You made "a braid".</i></p>	225 SL ST
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cut the yarn, leaving 15-20 cm length • Pull the yarn out and remove middle part • Use a lighter to melt a tip of yarn tail to fasten off. • Last loop making: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Insert hook into the middle of first SL ST from back to front. 2. Grab working yarn and pull it out. 3. Insert crochet hook into the middle of previous SL ST from back to front. 4. Grab working yarn and pull it out on wrong side. 5. You made last loop. • Hide remained yarn tail on wrong side and weave in to fasten off. 	

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
